Not illustrated. 1918 Excerpt: .hydrochloric (muriatic) acid into a glass or crockery vessel (not metal) and add strips of sheet zinc until no more can be dissolved. To this add an equal quantity of water. Label this Flux and use carefully. When canning, have one vessel (a can will do) with enough flux in it to clean the tools. Keep the quantity to be used in sealing cans separately in a glass bottle. Cleaning and Tinning the Steel and Copper. It is of first importance to have the capping steel and tipping copper in a good condition. These may need to be rubbed with coarse sandpaper or on a soft brick to smooth them, or the steel may have to be filed to take the rust off. In the latter case care must be taken to keep the edge of the steel true. Both the capping steel and tipping copper...
